Welcome to Half Term 2 at The Bulwell Academy!

Remembrance Day, 11 November: Honoring Through Reflection and Respect

Key Activities Include:

Remembrance Assembly

Whole School Reflection

Students will take part in creative sessions during Wellbeing Wednesday, producing poppies, artwork, and messages of peace to be displayed in our Community Hub.

Remembrance Wall & Display:

A memorial wall will be created in the Community Hub, showcasing student contributions and offering a space for reflection.

• Quiet Reflection Space:

A dedicated space will be set up in the library or a classroom, featuring peaceful music and books about war and peace, offering students a calm environment for personal reflection.
