Job Description:

Maths Ambassadors at The Bulwell Academy are responsible for nurturing and growing a love of Maths outside of the classroom.

Maths Ambassadors will endeavour to, supported by the Maths Department, plan and lead a broad and ambitious offering of Mathematical initiatives and events to inspire and encourage all pupils.

Maths Ambassadors are required to be inclusive, proactive, committed and above all, enthusiastic to drive change.

Key Roles and Responsibilities:

- Lead on planning, organising, and promoting student events such as lunchtime clubs, after school activities and whole school events.
- Work closely and collaboratively with the Maths Ambassador team to successfully achieve a common goal. This could include, but is not limited to, attending meetings, brainstorming and contributing positively to discussions.
- Communicate important updates, events, and resources to the student body – for example, announcements in assembly, production of a Powerpoint to be shown in lessons or production of a poster to advertise an event.

Expectations and Requirements:

Maths Ambassadors are role models within the school and must demonstrate their best at all times. Any Ambassador who acts in a way that does not meet our high expectations (as detailed below) runs the risk of having the position of Maths Ambassador being removed.

- Maths Ambassadors are expected to demonstrate the school values of Aspire, Work Hard and Be Kind at all times.
- Ambassadors must be in full uniform, to include blazer, top buttons done up, ties on and appropriate black school shoes. All uniform expectations must be adhered to.

- Attendance at school is essential. Ambassadors must not have more than 4 days off in an academic year.
- Ambassadors must be on time to school and ALL lessons.
- High levels of effort must be shown across all lessons – this must be demonstrated by a 2 or higher in character reports across all subjects.
- Maths Ambassadors should complete homework on a regular basis and must maintain a positive kickboard balance.
- Maths Ambassadors should be approachable, polite and dedicated to promoting an inclusive and supportive student community
