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Dear Parents / Carers

I hope this letter finds you all well. Can I please once again thank you for the support you have shown the school in the last few months of lockdown. It has not been an easy time for any of us and we have very much appreciated your ongoing support.

As you will be aware the government has announced that, provided there are no further complications with regards to Covid-19, we are able to begin to welcome Year 10 students back into school for **some** face to face contact from 15 June. In the first instance we have arranged for each student in year 10 to have a one to one tutorial session with a key member of staff.

The reason for this one to one tutorial is so that we can:

- Find out how your child has been during lockdown and to reflect on their learning during the last term
- Consider what support they may require moving forward and plan such support.
- Ensure that they are on track and fully prepared for their journey into year 11.

We feel these tutorials are very important and would very much like all students to attend their session and ask that they please bring with them any paper copies of work that they have completed during the lockdown period.

I have included a personal invite for your child with the date and time of their individual session and ask that if they are unable to attend at the given time you email or contact Mr Elland, so that we can re-arrange this for you.

Following these meetings, we are planning some small group sessions in the week of 22 June. In these sessions, students will be able to come together and catch up as well as share and discuss any issues or concerns they may have.



We will try and put the groups together for these sessions based on small friendship groups where possible as we are aware some students have not seen their friends since school had to close its doors to them.

From the week of 29 June, we will be running small group intervention sessions for Year 10. The current guidance is that we can only have 25% of the year group in on any one day and we will, therefore, be looking at having around 40 students in school each day.

Lessons will not be as students are used to as there will only be 8 students in a classroom at the most and not all subjects will be able to be delivered. This will mean students will be invited in one day a week in the first instance. For the remaining four days students will continue to be set work to complete at home. I will send more information regarding this nearer the time.

We have very much missed your child and are looking forward to welcoming them back into school.
