If you wish to speak to someone about a child or young person's behavioural or emotional need, please contact the Behavioural and Emotional Health Team on 0115 8761716. This support is provided as part of the Nottingham City pathway for children and young people with behavioural, emotional or mental health needs. The pathway is for children and young people who:

- Present with concerns about their behaviour, emotional wellbeing or mental health.
- Present with concerns about possible ASD or ADHD.
- Are registered with an NHS Nottingham City GP.
- Are aged 0 to 18 (the pathway extends up to the age of 24 where the young person has an Education, Health and Care Plan - EHCP).

If you need any help and support accessing the service or you would like to discuss your child's needs in more detail, we offer a parent/carer SEND drop-in service.
